

If you have something to share at the conference, consider submitting an application to present a Hi-5 talk! Whether you submitted a paper and want to use it to create interest in your session, or you didn't submit a paper but have relevant information or research to share related to diversity and inclusion in engineering, computing and/or technology, Hi-5's are for you! These high-energy five minute talks give you an opportunity to share your content and pose questions for the audience to consider. You have 20 or fewer slides and exactly 15 seconds per slide to tell us in a fun and engaging way the results of your research/program/initiative, etc. If you are unfamiliar with these talks, search the terms "Pecha Kucha" or "Ignite" talks to find examples. Due to time limitations, we will only be able to select at most 10-12 submissions for final presentation at the conference. **Submit your Hi-5 proposal by March 2nd** by emailing ross@msoe.edu and include the following information:

1. Title of your presentation
2. Contact information for all authors and presenter (name, institution, email)
3. Brief summary which describes the content of your presentation, its potential impact, and audience takeaways
4. Abstract for conference program (300 words or less)

You may include your proposal information in the email itself or as an MS Word attachment. Please consider the following timeline as you prepare your materials:
