Biography

Dr. Lohmann is vice provost and professor of Industrial and Systems Engineering at the Georgia Institute of Technology. His principal responsibilities include institutional development, review, and accreditation of the Georgia Techs academic programs. Dr. Lohmann most recently served as associate dean in the College of Engineering at Georgia Tech, and has also held appointments at the National Science Foundation, the University of Michigan, the University of Southern California, and l'École Centrale Paris in France.

Dr. Lohmann earned his B.S.M.E. from Oklahoma State University and his M.S. and Ph.D. in Industrial Engineering and Engineering Management at Stanford University. His research and teaching interests are in the field of capital budgeting and economic decision analysis, and he has also provided leadership in a number of educational initiatives involving accreditation, globalization, and engineering education research. External sponsors of his work include: AT&T, Continental AG, GM, Hewlett-Packard, IBM, Microsoft Research, Motorola, National Science Foundation, Procter & Gamble, Sloan Foundation, and the United Engineering Foundation. Dr. Lohmann is also Editor of the Journal of Engineering Education and a Fellow of the Institute of Industrial Engineers, the American Society of Engineering Education, and the European Society for Engineering Education. In 2007, he received the John L. Imhoff Global Excellence Award from the American Society for Engineering Education for his international contributions.
