

Call for Abstracts: 2016 ASEE Conference/Exposition

The *Architectural Engineering Division* seeks abstracts of papers, for presentation, to review for the *2016 ASEE Annual Conference & Exposition*. Abstracts from academia and industry related to the *teaching* of architectural and construction engineering, engineering technology and building science are highly encouraged. This division of ASEE has a Publish-to-Present requirement, and abstracts are subject to a blind peer review process. Topics of interest include those addressing the following themes:

- Structures and Structural Education
- Sustainability
- Integrating LEED content and/or certification into learning outcomes
- Interiors in Architecture and Architectural Engineering coursework
- Instructional Strategies for B.I.M.
- Digital Design and Design Visualization
- Assessment of architectural/engineering courses, programs, instructional methods
- Innovative use of Technology in the Classroom
- Service Learning Projects
- Innovative new courses or teaching methods
- Cooperative efforts between education and industry
- International education and teaching experiences
- Integrating design into the curriculum
- Co-ops and Internships
- Capstone Design Projects
- Attrition and Recruitment of Architectural Engineering Students

Works in Progress: Additionally, there is an option to submit papers describing work in progress – projects designed or begun but not yet complete in their data and conclusions. If submitting a paper of this nature, it must be noted in the title and/or abstract as a ‘work in progress’ to be considered for this category.

While papers submitted are often descriptive, we value research based upon quantitative or qualitative methodologies related to architectural/engineering education.
